SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1:- Wolverhampton & South Staffordshire Car Club Ltd will organise a Clubman permit autotest on Saturday 22nd August 2026.

2: All profit from the event, after event expenses have been paid, will go to CANCER RESEARCH

3: The event will be held at:

Mill Lane Acton Gate, Stafford, (what3words, powder.wedge.snake)

4:- The meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) these supplementary regulations and any written instructions that the organizing club may issue for the event.

5:- Motorsport UK permit: TBA.

6:- The event is open to:

Fully elected members of WSSCC Ltd

Fully elected members of the following invited motor clubs:

Cannock and District, Owen Motoring Club, Telford Car Club, Ludlow Castle Motor Club, Whitchurch Motor Club

7:- All competitors must produce a valid Motorsport UK competition licence, championship registration card, and/or club membership card.

8:- Any competitor not signed on by 09.45 am maybe refused a start. A drivers meeting will be held at 09.50 am by the results hut. The first car will start at 10.00 am.

9:- The event will consist of two classes:

Front Wheel Drive cars & Rear Wheel Drive cars.

10:- Awards will be as follows:

Fastest Time of the Day

1st in class (subject to 3 starters)	An award
2nd in class (subject to 6 starters)	An award
3rd in class (subject to 10 starters)	An award
1st novice (subject to 3 starters)	An award

A novice is defined as having not won an award on a Clubmans Autotest or higher.

The entry list opens on publication of these Supplementary Regulations and closes on Tuesday 18th August 2026.

12:- Provisional results can be checked throughout the day

All tests will be timed to the 1/10 second using hand held stop watch

Any protests must be made in accordance with section 9.1. Otherwise, results will become final 30 minutes after the last competitor finishes the last test.

13:- Details of tests will be sent out with Final Instructions and printed off by the competitor. Drivers will have one run at each test layout.

Timing will be done manually. The starting signal will be “in your own time”.

The order of attempting tests will be at the organiser’s discretion.

14:- Marking of penalties will be as (19.9)

(Wrong test) a maximum penalty of 20 seconds will be imposed when the route around the markers is not followed as shown on the diagram and/or a line is crossed in the incorrect direction. A test will not be incorrect if the driver realises his/her mistake, goes back to the point at which the mistake occurred, and then completes the test correctly as required by the diagram.

The maximum penalty imposed will not exceed the time set by the fastest competitor in that class plus 20 seconds. In the event of there only being one competitor in a class the fastest time set by that competitor on a repeat of the test in question from another round will be used as the base time.

15:- Practicing will NOT be allowed (19.1.2.4)

However, competitors are allowed to “walk the course”

16:- Competitors will be identified by numbers supplied by the organisers.

17:- All General Regulations of Motorsport UK apply as written except the following, which are modified:

19.1.2.7. Pylons may be less than 1m in height.

19.3.1.2. Vehicles need not be taxed or registered (except for classes E & F), as the event takes place wholly on private property.

19.2.7.4. A vehicle may be entered twice but must be driven by different drivers.

18:- Please make sure that your vehicle is in good mechanical condition and complies with MS UK regulations 19.3. and 7.4. and noise requirements of 7.8.2. and tyre regulations 7.13. Competitors are advised that the use of aggressive patterned forest rally type tyres is not permitted.

19:- In the event of a claim having to be made for damage caused to a third party by a competitor, the organisers of the event reserve the right to reclaim the insurance excess under the Motorsport UK policy (currently £500.00) from the competitor(s) involved.

20:- The club would like to thank landowner James Holt for his kind assistance in the running of this event.

21:- All documentation, wherever possible, will be issued in advance to all competitors and marshals to complete before arriving at the venue.

22:- Sustainability survey: - As you are probably aware in order to comply with current MS UK policy, we are required to make a sustainability report. Information regarding your traveling arrangements will be requested at documentation.

23:- Child Protection Policy
