Your start time will be 22.30 + your car number.



Noise & Scrutineering

Proceed for noise check and scrutineering, which will start at 17:30 hrs and close at 20:00hrs

Follow the arrowed 1 way system in place with a max speed of 5mph on site.

All tyres must be E-marked.

On completion of noise check and scrutineering (see map below), proceed to the car park marshal where you will be guided to your allocated slot please follow the arrowed 1 way system in place with a max speed of 5mph on site.



Signing On

Signing On will open at 17:30 hrs and close at 20:30 hrs this can be found inside the main halls building.

All outstanding monies to be paid in CASH ONLY.

After signing on, competitors will receive a rally pack containing rally plates, time cards and other relevant information.

Insurance

All competitors using the REIS Insurance must complete the REIS Driver Declaration Form.

Licences

Competitors are required to hold possession of a valid Motorsport UK RS interclub or higher grade licence.

All competitors will need the latest edition of Ordnance Survey Maps 126 and 137 (1:50 000 series latest edition).

Marshals

Please be aware that the stipulation no marshal no start will be strictly enforced. All competitors must sign on a marshal. This is regardless of whether all the controls may have been filled. Competitors, who are unable to supply a marshal, irrespective of their location and distance travelled to come to the event, will be turned away at signing on. This may seem harsh, but there will be NO exceptions. Please do not ask us to relax this rule, as refusal often offends.

Marshals will be expected to wear reflective clothing, which should be supplied by either the marshal themselves or by their competitor.

Please remind your marshals not to litter!

Damage

All competitors are reminded that it is their duty to report any damage caused to third party property, no matter how insignificant they feel it might be. This can be detailed on the Damage Declaration form and handed in at MC4.

All competitors are required to visit damage control and hand in their damage declaration at MC4 in order to be classified as a finisher as detailed in R15.1 - R15.1.2.

Competitors that have been involved in an accident should act as noted below:-

Section 170 Road Traffic Act 1988

DUTY OF DRIVER TO STOP, REPORT ACCIDENT AND GIVE INFORMATION OR DOCUMENTS

1) This section applies in a case where, owing to the presence of a mechanically propelled vehicle on a road, an accident occurs by which -

(a) personal injury is caused to a person other than the driver of that mechanically propelled vehicle, or

(b) damage is caused -

(i) to a vehicle other than that mechanically propelled vehicle or a trailer drawn by that mechanically propelled vehicle, or

(ii) to an animal other than an animal in or on that mechanically propelled vehicle or a trailer drawn by that mechanically propelled vehicle, or

(iii) to any other property constructed on, fixed to, growing in or otherwise forming part of the land on which the road in question is situated or land adjacent to such land

(2) The driver of the mechanically propelled vehicle must stop and, if required to do so by any person having reasonable grounds for so requiring, give his name and address and also the name and address of the owner and the identification marks of the vehicle.

(3) If for any reason the driver of the mechanically propelled vehicle does not give his name and address under subsection (2) above, he must report the accident.

(4) A person who fails to comply with subsection (2) or (3) above is guilty of an offence.

(5) If, in a case where this section applies by virtue of subsection (1)(a) above, the driver of a motor vehicle does not at the time of the accident produce such a certificate of insurance or security, or other evidence, as is mentioned in section 165(2) of this Act -

(a) to a constable, or

(b) to some person who, having reasonable grounds for so doing, has required him to produce it, the driver must report the accident and produce such a certificate or other evidence. This subsection does not apply to the driver of an invalid carriage.

(6) To comply with a duty under this section to report an accident or to produce such a certificate of insurance or security, or other evidence, as is mentioned in section 165(2)(a) of certificate of insurance or security, or other evidence, as is mentioned in section 165(2)(a) of this Act, the driver -

(a) must do so at a police station or to a constable, and

(b) must do so as soon as is reasonably practicable and, in any case, within twenty-four hours of the occurrence of the accident.

(7) A person who fails to comply with a duty under section (5) above is guilty of an offence, but he shall not be convicted by reason only of a failure to produce a certificate or other evidence if, within seven days after the occurrence of the accident, the certificate or other evidence is produced at a police station that was specified by him at the time when the accident was reported.

(8) In this section "animal" means horse, cattle, ass, mule, sheep, pig, goat or dog.

Road Traffic Act 1988, s 170 amended by the Road Traffic Act 1991, Sch 4 Rule 286 – Highway Code

If you are involved in a collision which causes damage or injury to any other person, vehicle, animal or property, you **MUST**

- stop
- give your own and the vehicle owner's name and address, and the registration number of the vehicle, to anyone having reasonable grounds for requiring them
- if you do not give your name and address at the time of the collision, report it to the police as soon as reasonably practicable, and in any case within 24 hours
